Notes from the Artist

I am fascinated by the way light illuminates objects as it falls onto them. The colours and contrasts that are portrayed in nature in the fur of an animal or the feathers of a bird hold endless possibilities. It is only once we really start to explore that we see the finer details and colours that otherwise often go unnoticed. Studying an animal or bird while creating an artwork gives me a sense of closeness and all those hours spent painting them feels like time spent in the wild with them.




Notes from the Artist



Notes from the Artist

My style of painting and subject matter vary and I don't use watercolour in a very traditional way. My botanicals are very modern and fall somewhere between modern botanicals and a contemporary still lives. I often leave elements of my botanicals 'unfinished' and emphasize the use of line and the importance of the negative spaces around the work, something that has stayed with me since my days of line drawing whilst studying. My landscapes however, although all inspired by the African weather, seasons and landscape around me, are abstracted depicting my own version of the Africa that I know. My use of colour in both my landscapes and botanicals is usually very bold, lending itself to how I see the natural world around me in all its splendour.



Notes from the Artist

I had an itch that lasted about 20 years. I was doing alright, but wasn't truly fulfilled. I was a plumber – yes, a far cry from being an artist.

There is nothing wrong with being a plumber – hell, it's a safe job! I even found satisfaction in beautiful level copper pipes and well laid drains. I could not, however, shake the desire to create something magical. I escaped back into the wild and now find myself happily working as a game ranger. In nature I feel at home and inspiration for my artwork is drawn from the animals I have come to know.


Notes from the Artist

This is a hyper realistic bronze of an elephant named Tim who lived in the Amboseli Game Reserve in Kenya. He was one of the last living 'Big Tuskers'. Tim died of natural causes at the age of 50 in February 2020. His tusks were 9 and 7 feet long. I chose to immortalize Tim in bronze as a tribute to him as he has had a larger than life existence with several poaching attempts on his life and a few other near death experiences. In one instance he became bogged down in mud and would have died if it were not for the quick intervention of local park rangers and veterinarians. In another case he was darted to remove a poachers spear that was lodged in his ear flap.

Notes from the Artist

I feel daily that I am so lucky to be able to connect with an animal or bird through my hands. I get an intimate understanding of each creature this way, which I don't get by just looking. I have noticed that each animal within a species is so different. I work from many photos of the chosen type of animal or bird I am making; photos I take or from other people. Each animal, like humans, are so different, both is their physical traits and well as personalities.

So often we identify it as a White Rhino or Cape Robin because of its identifying marks etc. But when you really look closely the differences between each individual one are huge and I have to choose. Often a work takes me ages to make because I keep changing my mind about which I prefer on the day; longer horn, sloping eye, different shaped nose, longer back. In the end I try to choose the most representative of that animal that I can, but really, the final sculpture becomes about all of them, melded into one final work



In 1961 an 'epic' movie came on the scene, named "Hatari" (danger in Swahili), the star of the film was John Wayne in his heyday and the opening scenes were taken in the Amboseli Game Reserve of the capture team attempting to lasoo a Black Rhino from a fast moving U.S. Army jeep, which the Rhino eventually turned on and did considerable damage before running loping off completely unscathed.

At the time the movie was released I was 14 years old and that part of the epic picture has stuck with me ever since. This Black Rhino that I have completed in bronze encapsulates my memory of the film "Hatari". What an epic it was....!



'TAKE YOUR BEST SHOT is a sculpture that is close to my heart,' it symbolizes the hardships the species are going through in order to survive!

The sculptures body is armour plated which resembles the struggle of law enforcement and of game rangers in their mission to protect the rhino. The horn is the focus point and takes the sculpture to a height of 440mm. Bullets on the rhino's legs symbolise the struggle of the animal to survive blows from manmade machines that aim to kill. Standing on a pile of coins indicates what little monetary value the rhino horn is sold for in comparison to saving the animal for future generations.

I purchased my first Fine-Art Photographic Book, 'The Dark Side of the Kalahari' in 2014, which inspired me to pursue my dream relentlessly, and led me to some of the most breathtaking and remote places of Southern Africa! Today I am fortunate enough to operate a photographic safari company and various photo and film projects in the Greater Kruger Region of South Africa as well as in the Okavango and Savuti Regions of Botswana, living out my dream daily while sharing my special experiences with people across the globe.



This allows non-releasable vultures to positively contribute to saving their wild counterparts by producing viable offspring which can and which are released into the wild to re-inforce dwindling populations and in future, to bring vultures back into historical breeding sites where they have become extinct.

Vultures are the fastest declining group of birds globally and although they are often maligned, they are critical to the health of our environment. Vultures provide critical ecosystem services through the removal of carcasses and consequently, diseases from the anthropogenic and natural landscapes. Africa is in the throes of a vulture crisis with some species having declined by up to 96% in the last 3 decades.

The Multi Species Action Plan has shed light as to some of the conservation actions and strategies which should be implemented in order to attempt to halt the ongoing declines of vultures across the African continent. This includes the mitigation of threats; as well as possible breeding programmes for population supplementation and reintroduction programmes.

The Asian Vulture Crisis highlighted the importance of vultures when catastrophic consequences took place when 99,9% of Asian vulture species were decimated by a single threat in the 20th century. Since then, the Indian government has spent over 23 billion US Dollars to address human health issues relating to a dysfunctional ecosystem, resulting in disease epidemics causing losses to human lives; not to mention the effects on domesticated animals.

South Africa is a stronghold for southern Africa's only endemic vulture species namely; the Cape Vulture (*Gyps coprotheres*). It has been estimated that only 4200 breeding pairs remain and with breeding extinctions already occurring in Namibia, Zimbabwe and Swaziland. The most abundant African vulture, the African White-backed Vulture (*Gyps africanus*) is now estimated to go extinct within the next 20 years unless current declines are halted.

VulPro, established in 2007, is a dedicated vulture conservation organization, based just outside of Hartbeespoort Dam in the North West Province. It is home to the largest captive population of African vultures in the world, currently standing at over 270 non-releasable vultures, made up of five African vulture species. VulPro, is a multi-faceted vulture conservation organization. We believe in an all-encompassing conservation approach, in order to halt the ongoing declines of vultures in Africa. This entails mitigating new and existing threats, rehabilitation and release of injured and or grounded vultures; followed by population supplementation, and reintroduction programmes using non-releasable individuals. All of this work is intertwined with multiple research projects, involving population monitoring and surveys, tracking of vultures, veterinary related research studies, to name just a few. Combined with research, education is fundamental in changing people's perceptions of vultures, not only in Africa, but globally, and VulPro does this successfully by engaging with all demographics, age groups, classes of individuals etc, to convert and influence the decision leaders of today and future leaders of tomorrow.

COVID 19—Letter from Endangered Wildlife Trust - CEO

We are living through history, and the only thing one can be certain of right now is that change will continue to define our lives for the foreseeable future. It is safe to say that the world will never be as we knew it to be just a few months ago. In itself, this may not be a bad thing and we have a unique opportunity to rewrite the story of humankind's modern colonization of Planet Earth, and to redefine what it means to live in harmony with each other and sustainably with Mother Nature, going forward.

The Endangered Wildlife Trust is in full support of the measures taken to curb the rapid spread of COVID-19 by our national leadership, despite the significant socio-economic impacts of the lockdown on all South Africans. We too, are not untouched by the pandemic and the economic crisis that has taken hold and threatens to grow in the oncoming months. But we are also determined to be part of developing solutions and to play a big role in rebuilding our economy and reshaping our society.

Conservation and wildlife protection are deemed essential services under the current lockdown regulations, which has allowed the EWT to continue undertaking critical conservation work in the interests of saving some of our most threatened species. Under stringent social distancing and hygienic practices, our staff have used essential work permits to:

- save an entire pack of ten Endangered Wild Dogs from near certain persecution in the Waterberg and relocate to them their new home in the Lapalala Wilderness;
- rescue an injured juvenile Black Sparrowhawk from possible persecution due to repeated chicken killing;
- rescue a Blue Crane entangled in bailing twine on a farm in the Overberg;
- rescue an injured Tawny Eagle and a Cape Vulture;
- screen cargo at our airports through our K9 teams, for wildlife contraband; and

conduct an investigation on an Eskom transmission line that was responsible for killing several Pelicans.

The EWT's continued fight to save our wildlife does not just benefit those species. We are working tirelessly to support our rural communities whose livelihoods have been suspended, through the provision of skills development and training resources, online capacity building courses, water provision and even food parcel delivery. Many of our staff members are contributing, in their personal capacity, to food provision for the most vulnerable, and the spirit of Ubuntu runs deep in our culture.

Despite our committed actions in the present, our vision is firmly on the future and we are clear in our purpose. We understand the challenges felt by the tourism industry and the threats posed to the sector by a world under continued lockdown. We know that this won't end overnight. But we also know this:

Africa with her extraordinary wildlife diversity, vast wilderness, open landscapes, spirit of adventure and unique cultural heritage can present endless opportunities for the emergence of a thriving low touch tourism economy. Wildlife and ecotourism lends itself better than any other form of tourism to low density, social distancing oriented activities and high value experiences, which are rewarding to both the tourist and the communities and conservation areas they support.

We know that tourism can potentially absorb the most unskilled people in South Africa, a large number of entrepreneurs, a high percentage of women and those of a lower mean age than many other sectors. We also recognise the importance of this sector to the upliftment of rural communities and to the continued conservation of our most threatened species. We know that tourism brings much needed funding to maintain the integrity of our protected area network and above all, we recognise the simple truth that tourists largely come to Africa to see and experience wildlife.

What is our role in a COVID world?

The EWT's work ensures that we retain our broad diversity of wild species and wild places for tourists to visit; that we have functioning ecosystems on which rural people can depend and thrive; that we continue to train rural farmers to be resilient and self-sufficient; that the illicit wildlife trade is brought under better control; and that our country emerges from this crisis as a stronger leader in global conservation in a world that has begun to finally understand the impact of undervaluing and under protecting wildlife.

This is why we need you.

Yet everyone else does and the number of those in need is overwhelming. We understand this but in this troubled time, we need our supporters most of all, to keep us out there and working for a world that values and conserves its wildlife resources and natural capital. We need YOUR support NOW so that our work can be catalytic and support so many more. We need YOUR support NOW to build a future that has opportunities for millions more, and we need YOUR support NOW to keep us going so that future generations can enjoy everything that we all have.
